About the Sector - key facts



"Voluntary sector organisations work to achieve social or environmental goals. They are independent, not driven by profit (reinvesting any profit back into their communities) and are run by individuals who do not get paid for running the organisation".

The Scottish voluntary sector encompasses over 46,500 community groups, charities and social enterprises, contributing to the well-being of people and communities across Scotland.

Organisations range from grassroots community groups, arts and sports clubs and village halls, to large housing and social care providers. Around half of all voluntary organisations are registered charities.

Boundaries between the voluntary, public and private sectors can be subjective and are often blurry.

SCVO uses the following criteria to assess whether an organisation is part of the voluntary, or third, sector:

- Social, environmental or public benefit
- Organised, i.e. have a constitution
- Self-governing, i.e. fully responsible for any decisions, including winding up the organisation
- Non-statutory i.e. independent from government
- Non-profit distributing (any profits generated are reinvested in the organisation/community not passed to shareholders or directors, and there is an 'asset lock')
- Volunteer-led i.e. run by unpaid board members



The number of new charities being registered with OSCR remains fairly stable, at just under 800 in 2024.

Despite the pandemic and the challenging funding environment, the number of organisations applying to OSCR for charitable status remains high at 700-800 per year.

However, while the number of charities being wound up dipped during Covid, it is now rising. Over 1,000 charities were removed from OSCR's Scottish Charity Register in both 2023 and 2024, significantly higher than in previous years.

OSCR is currently undertaking a major programme to remove inactive charities from the register so it is unclear how many charities have been removed due to this exercise, and how many have closed due to other factors such as funding or volunteer shortages.







88% of voluntary organisations are local


79% of Scottish charities are local 98% of community groups are local

The majority of organisations are small regardless of their geographical scope.


Many international charities work in very local areas, eg in a specific region, or with a specific school or orphanage. Similarly many national charities are small, for example those dealing with very specialist interests or rare health issues.






Geographical Information - urban/rural split and deprivation (SIMD)

Urban / Rural split

• 34% of Scottish voluntary organisations are based in remote or rural locations (based on the postcode of their main office) despite only 21% of the Scottish population living in these areas.

Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD)

The SIMD chart bottom left matches postcodes to SIMD 'quintiles' or fifths - in other words you would expect data to map closely to the 20% line if there was no variation (see https://simd.scot).

- 15% of voluntary organisations are based in the 20% most deprived areas, a bit lower than you might expect.
- A slightly higher 19% of sector spending is linked to organisations based in the most deprived areas.
- 89% of these organisations are based in Urban areas. *click* on the red '1 (Most deprived)' bar
- 18% of community groups and 12% of charities are based in the most deprived areas see Filters
- Half (51%) of voluntary organisations are in the low to middle ranges for deprivation (quintiles 3 and 4).
- Clicking on the bars on the left shows that Quintiles 3 and 4 are skewed towards rural areas. Rural areas have less concentrated pockets of poverty and wealth and so tend to sit in the middle of the SIMD ratings - one weakness of the SIMD indicator is that rural deprivation is often smoothed out and hidden.



The voluntary sector: who's in and who's out?



For the purpose of this State of the Sector report we have used the criteria below to define the voluntary sector:

Voluntary sector criteria

- Social, environmental or public benefit
- Organised, i.e. have a constitution
- Self-governing
- Non-statutory i.e. independent from government
- Non-profit distributing
- Volunteer-led i.e. run by unpaid board members

These criteria exclude 137 organisations which are registered charities, including universities and public sector bodies.

Most of these 137 charities are very large, and together they employ nearly 92,000 staff and had over £7bn turnover in 2023 - an economic footprint almost the size of the whole of the Scottish voluntary sector.

If we add the £7bn turnover of these charities to the £8.5bn income of the rest of the sector, the total turnover of charities in Scotland is over £15bn.
